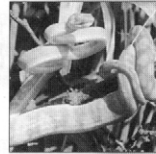

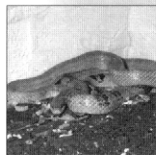

Without their enthusiasm, the society wouldn't have attained the level it currently holds. On behalf of all snake lovers, Thanks!

As a matter of fact, the new board had to deal with a major problem, the administration of membership did not function properly. Meanwhile measures have been taken and the board hopes that all will be well soon. We would like to take this opportunity, to apologise to all members who did not receive their

magazines in time and had to write, phone and e-mail over and over again, mostly without success. In order to solve this severe problem, the membership administration has been taken over - at least for the time being - by the secretary.
